


Fund Objective

A fund which is passively managed and aims to track the performance of S&P500 over the medium to long term (indexing strategy), which may be volatile in the short term. This fund seeks to provide medium to long-term capital appreciation.

Investment Strategy

The fund shall be passively managed, investing in a foreign Exchange Traded Fund ("ETF") that tracks the performance of the S&P500 Index.



Equity**Market Review**

FBMKLCI declined by 1.9% in May, reversing the rebound earlier in April. MSCI Malaysia also headed down by 1.9% in USD terms, undershooting MSCI ASEAN (+3.9% MoM) and MSCI EM (+4.3% MoM) in the month. Industrial was the only sector with positive returns, whilst rest of the sectors were in the red. IT, Consumer Discretionary, and Consumer Staples were the key laggards. Market breadth flipped to 10/20 advancers/decliner in May vs. 20/9 previous month. Average daily traded value rose by 16% MoM to US\$582mn.

Market Outlook

FBMKLCI declined by 1.9% in May, reversing the rebound earlier in April. MSCI Malaysia also headed down by 1.9% in USD terms, undershooting MSCI ASEAN (+3.9% MoM) and MSCI EM (+4.3% MoM) in the month. Industrial was the only sector with positive returns, whilst rest of the sectors were in the red. IT, Consumer Discretionary, and Consumer Staples were the key laggards. Market breadth flipped to 10/20 advancers/decliner in May vs. 20/9 previous month. Average daily traded value rose by 16% MoM to US\$582mn. Key index performances in the U.S. were back to positive, where the Dow Jones was up by 3.9% M/M, the S&P 500 improved by 6.2% M/M, and the Nasdaq surged by 9.6% M/M. Global markets extended their recovery in May, building on April's lows as consumer sentiment improved and trade tensions eased. Progress in U.S. trade negotiations with the E.U. and a temporary delay to planned tariff hikes reduced fears of a global recession and fueled broad-based gains across risk assets. U.S. stocks have outperformed most of their global peers in May.
