150 students across Peninsula Malaysia participates in the workshop

Kuala Lumpur, 10 October 2015 – Great Eastern Life Assurance (Malaysia) Berhad (Great Eastern Life) organised the Let's Score 'A' workshop for SPM candidates from registered children homes under Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) across Peninsula Malaysia. The Let's Score 'A' workshop is intended to help the students to be better prepared in their SPM examination. About 150 SPM candidates participated in the workshop to learn correct techniques and were given useful tips to answer exam questions for four (4) subjects namely Bahasa Malaysia, Science, Mathematics and English.

Reference books and past years exam questions were provided to the students in an effort to motivate and help them to be more prepared for their exams. Great Eastern Life's Director and Chief Executive Officer Dato Koh Yaw Hui said, "We believe that children, when empowered, are capable of developing to their fullest potential thus, creating better futures for themselves, their communities, and country. We are excited to be on this journey and will remain committed towards ensuring that these children are able to live great and have the future they deserve," he added.

He added, "This year ChildrenCare will be celebrating its 20th Anniversary and to date we have channeled more than RM2.2 million to over 180 children homes across the country. The Let's Score 'A' workshop is an association of Program Aspirasi Gemilang 'A' launched in August 2013 under the Great Eastern Life ChildrenCare. This Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative was the first of its kind by a life insurance company with the support of Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) under the Ministry of Women, Family and Community

Development, whereby students from JKM registered children homes are awarded RM100 for each 'A' they achieved in their public examinations namely UPSR, PT3 and SPM. This year's result impacted a 24% increase in the number of A's achieved as compared to 108 A's in 2014.
