UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN BENEFIT FROM LET'S SCORE 'A' WORKSHOP IN PREPARATION FOR THEIR UPSR EXAMINATION

Great Eastern Life ChildrenCare invites 70 students to attend revision programme

Kuala Lumpur, 13 August 2016 – Great Eastern Life Assurance (Malaysia) Berhad (Great Eastern Life) organised the Let's Score 'A' workshop for underprivileged students who will be sitting for their UPSR examination. The participants were selected from registered children homes across Malaysia under the care of Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM). As part of its long-term community project, ChildrenCare, the workshop is a comprehensive revision programme that aims to equip the students with proper answering techniques and useful tips in tackling exam questions. A total of 70 UPSR candidates attended the workshop and received guidance for Bahasa Malaysia, Science, Mathematics and English.

Designed to encourage an interactive learning process, the workshop was conducted in a quiz-like environment to ensure the students were fully engaged throughout the one-day programme. The sessions were well-received as the students were seen actively participating as the trainers guided them in answering different ranges of exam questions. Complimentary workbooks and notes were also provided and used throughout the sessions.

Director and Chief Executive Officer of Great Eastern Life, Dato Koh Yaw Hui said, "Education is a powerful tool that can help children unlock their potential and thus creating a brighter future for themselves, their communities and country. It is our hope that the workshop will give these underprivileged children an equal opportunity to achieve success and discover the limitless possibilities that lies ahead of them."

The Let's Score 'A' workshop is a supporting element of Program Aspirasi Gemilang 'A', an initiative launched under the Education pillar of ChildrenCare. It is the first Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) initiative of its kind by a life insurance company, where students from JKM registered children homes are awarded RM 100 for each 'A' they achieved in the national examinations namely UPSR, PT3 and SPM. For three (3) consecutive years, the

programme has shown increasingly positive results. This year's results would mark a magnificent 49 percent compared to last year's results, with a total of 197 A's achieved this year.

At the end of the workshop, the participants were seen exiting the hall and sharing their new found confidence with each other. Noraini Natasha aged 12, said, "I really learned a lot today thanks to the teachers. The techniques taught were not something I would find at school and they made every class so interesting. Now, I am more confident and prepared to answer any questions asked in the exam."

Since its establishment in 1995, Great Eastern Life ChildrenCare has raised more than RM 2.3 million to help over 180 underprivileged children homes under the purview of Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM). Besides donations, the funds also support the various ChildrenCare initiatives which revolve around its three core pillars namely education, health and wellness, and personal development.
