GREAT EASTERN LIFE CHILDRENCARE ORGANISED 2ND SERIES VEX ROBOTICS WORKSHOP FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN

Kuala Lumpur – Great Eastern Life Assurance (Malaysia) Berhad (Great Eastern Life) organised the VEX Educational Robotics Workshop for 105 children aged between 7 to 14 years old from registered children homes under the Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) recently. The workshop was organised as part of ChildrenCare, the company's long-term community project, established since 1995.

The workshop was held at Robotics Learning Malaysia, Bangsar Village II, Kuala Lumpur, where the children learnt about the concepts of designing, building and programming robots using VEX Robotics, an educational robotics curriculum developed by Carnegie Mellon Robotics Academy. The workshop provides a fun educational platform for the children to gain knowledge on robotics and robotics programming.

The children were taught about the concepts of designing, building and programming robots. They were given a task to construct a robot and a friendly competition ensued to determine the game-based engineering challenge. In addition, the children also developed soft skills such as leadership, teamwork, confidence, creative and analytical thinking.
